Qualitative methods for psychological research DISTANCE COURSE, July 18-21, 2022

Aims and topics

Qualitative research is more and more established as a scientific research method also in the scope of psychology. AIP Organisational and Social Psychology divisions are planning in 2022 a summer school dedicated to explore the technical-methodological features together with the election criteria of two methodological approaches which may be particularly heuristics in psychological research:

- **Interpretative Phenomenological Analysis: Principles and Procedure –** Interpretative Phenomenological Analysis is a well-established qualitative methodological approach to explore a wide range of lived experience. During the workshop participants will be introduced to the theoretical and methodological principles of this research approach. Participants will be also engaged in doing some practices and discussing case studies.
- **Visual Methods: Principles and applications** The analysis of visual data in social research is increasing. Visual devices can also be adopted in qualitative research in order to collect psycho-social data and to support participatory research projects. In this workshop participants will be introduced to the different methodological and technological principles related to the adoption of visual methods in qualitative research. Case of applications will be discussed. Participants will be also engaged in some practical exercises.

The summer school is organized in two dedicated workshops with renown international scholars, with a highly interactive didactic approach, based on lecturing, discussion of case studies and practices.

The integration of qualitative and quantitative methods of research could offer new emerging potentialities to uncover important insight in social and organizational psychology

Participants' selection by the scientific committee will be based on three criteria:

- a) **AIP affiliation.** Priority to AIP members and among them to members affiliated to the Organization and Social Psychology divisions;
- b) **Career**. Priority to younger researchers (PhD students, research fellows and post doc, temporary assistant professors, researcher with tenure);
- c) **Research area**. Priority to researchers who work on organizational and social psychology topics;
- d) **Researchers' university**. The selection will try to facilitate the participation of the greater number of universities (Doctoral schools and Departments).
